Spotlight on: Chief Financial Officers

The role of a CFO varies depending on the size and structure of each law firm, ranging from a very hands-on role to a supervisory role. The CFO is accountable for all departments within the finance division including Payroll, Billing, Accounts Payable, Accounts Receivable, General Ledger, Budgeting, Taxation, Partner Allocations and Financial Reporting. The CFO also has significant interaction with all other divisions to manage daily expenses and prepare budgets, and needs to liaise with external auditors, banks, leasing companies, financial systems consultants, supply vendors and other third parties. Although non-billable, the CFO is one of the top leadership positions within a law firm.
